

STUDIO GUIDELINES

Martorano's Low-Brass Studio, 2026-2027

*This two-page document outlines the general procedures and expectations for lessons.
Please read both sides and return them signed by students & guardians. Thanks!*

For Student

I. Working Toward Excellence

1. Daily Practice
 - a. Becoming a good musician requires regular focused practice.
 - b. For this reason, students are expected to **work on lesson assignments daily**.
 - i. Students will use a practice log to help them track their own progress.
 - ii. Lessons will cover focused practice techniques.
2. Achieving Goals
 - a. Each good musician has their own unique, personalized goals.
 - b. For this reason, students will work with Dr. Martorano to **create short- and long-term goals**.
 - i. Students will write their goal(s) on the top of their practice logs.
 - ii. Short-term goals focus on the week. Long-term goals focus on the semester/year.

II. Maximizing your Lesson Time

3. Be Punctual
 - a. A good musician spends time on a variety of topics in lessons (warm-up, scales, etudes/solos).
 - b. For this reason, students should arrive on **time/early for our weekly lesson**.
 - i. You can find our lesson times on the studio calendar at www.martoranolowbrassstudio.com
4. Be Prepared
 - a. A good musician is always ready to perform!
 - b. For this reason, students should bring all required material to lessons, such as:
 - i. Their instrument & mouthpiece
 - ii. Lessons folder & assigned music
 - iii. Metronome/tuner (or an equivalent smartphone app)
 - iv. Pencil (or an equivalent note-taking device)
5. Be Creative
 - a. Students are encouraged to take a more active role in their musical education.
 - i. Students are welcome to bring in / suggest different music for solo study.
 - ii. Students are welcome to form small chamber ensembles (ask Dr. Martorano for music).

III. Maintain Your Instrument

6. Cleaning and Oiling Brass
 - a. Brass instruments require regular special oil to function properly.
 - b. For this reason, students should **regularly use valve oil and slide grease on their horn**.
 - i. Valve oil should be used at least once a week; Slide grease should at least once a month.
 - ii. Dr. Martorano will provide recommendations and guidance in this process.

Guardian Guidelines

I. Scheduling Lessons

1. Signing Up
 - a. Sign-ups are first-come, first-served, and Dr. Martorano will work hard to accommodate every schedule.
 - b. To sign up, please email Guy.Martorano@gmail.com, including:
 - i. Preferred lesson time (before/during /after school).
 - ii. Preferred lesson duration (20-60 min, depending on age/skill level).
 - c. A "Lesson Confirmation Email" will be sent upon successful scheduling.

2. Cancellations and Rescheduling Procedures

- a. If a lesson needs to be canceled/rescheduled, please do so 24 hours in advance.
- b. Cancellations:
 - i. To cancel a lesson, please email Guy.Martorano@gmail.com.
- c. Rescheduling a lesson:
 - i. In-person lessons are preferable for rescheduled lessons, but online lessons are available.
 - ii. To reschedule a lesson, please email Guy.Martorano@gmail.com.
 1. Dr Martorano will work with each individual to help find a mutually available time.

II. Encouraging Excellence

As the old saying goes, “It takes a village to raise a child”. I will work with them one-on-one in weekly lessons; Their band directors will work with them daily in class. You can help your child achieve their very best by encouraging excellent performance. You know them best: their personality, their likes/dislikes, their habits. Encouraging excellence will look different from person to person. A couple of suggestions: help them set aside practice time or maybe even have them perform for the family. The sky is the limit!!!

III. Lesson Invoices and Payments

3. Lesson Rates

- a. Lessons are rated at \$60.00 per hour and proportionally valued:
 - i. Example: 20 min lesson is \$20.00

4. Monthly Invoice

- a. Invoices are sent at the end of each month and are due at the end of the next month:
 - i. Example: Month of Lessons – May Invoice Sent – May 31st Date Due – June 30th

5. Payment Methods

- a. The most convenient way to pay is online through PayPal, Venmo, Cash App, or Zelle.
 - i. Links to each are at the bottom of our invoices.
- b. You can also pay by personal check or cash.
 - i. If paying by check, please specify the month/student’s name in the memo.
 - ii. If paying by cash, please put it in a sealed envelope with the month/student’s name on the front.
- c. **Late payments will result in a \$25.00 late fee added to the following invoice.**
 - i. After two months of unpaid lessons, lessons will halt until payment has been made in full.
